VIP/Media Race

The VIP/Media Race will take place on Monday 15th July. Long and Short courses will be available, and the race will be through central Edinburgh. Starts are between 17:00 and 18:00. The Event Arena is in Nicolson Square Gardens which is 1.5km from the WOC Event Centre at Pollock Halls. You can register to take part in the Arena when you arrive.

Please note that the Event Arena is on the edge of the embargoed area for the WOC Knock-out sprint. If you need to observe the embargo then you must to travel along East Preston Street and South Clerk Street to get from Pollock Halls to the event.

Sprint Relay – Riccarton Campus

When	Sunday 14 th July (pm)
Venue	Heriot-Watt University was initially established in 1821 to provide practical knowledge of science and technology to Edinburgh's working men. It became a university in 1966, and began the development of a new campus on the Riccarton Estate, to the south- west of the city.
	The campus area now includes various blocks of student accommodation, a business park, a hotel, Scotland's elite Oriam Sports Performance Centre facility and the UK's first FlexBIO flexible downstream bioprocessing centre, all set in attractive parkland. The campus is adjacent to the Hermiston Park and Ride and is served by buses from the city centre.
Arena	The Oriam, Heriot-Watt University GPS coordinates: <u>55.909407, -3.3159257</u> Distance from Event Centre: 11km
Terrain	The area features university buildings in parkland. Running surfaces will be a mix of paved surfaces, unpaved paths and natural terrain, including significant areas of grass and runnable woodland. 15%–25% of courses will be on grass and other natural surfaces. The competition area is predominantly flat with some gentle gradients.
Media Centre	Sports Hall at The Oriam. This is within 100m of the Arena.
Maps	Maps will be available from the Media Centre from around 11.30.

Arena access	All accredited media will have access to the ticketed area at the Arena with a view of the relay changeover.
From Pollock Halls	#2 or #33 bus (3 an hour) from the "Commonwealth Pool" stop to the "Caledonian Village" stop on Dalry Road. Change to the #25 bus (4 an hour) to "The Avenue" stop [*] .
From Central Edinburgh	#25 or #34 bus (6 an hour) from Princes Street to the "The Avenue" stop [*] . Tram stop: Edinburgh Park Station (2.5km away)
Parking	Hermiston Park and Ride (free).

^{*} If you are taking part in the WOC Tour event after the Sprint Relay then please walk from the "Hermiston Park and Ride" stop (800m) to avoid entering the competition area.

Race History

The first World Orienteering Championships Sprint Relay was held in 2014 in Italy.

Edinburgh 2024 will be the 8th time the event has been held.

Great Britain's only medal is a silver from WOC 2022 in Denmark. The team then was Charlotte Ward, Ralph Street, Kris Jones and Megan Carter-Davis. Ralph and Kris will be in the team again this year.
